





Title V in Iowa FFY 2015




Women/Maternal Health Performance Measure

- ▶ **National Performance Measure:**
 - ▶ Percent of women with a past year preventative visit



Perinatal/Infant Health Performance Measure

- ▶ **National Performance Measure:**
 - ▶ A) Percent of infants ever breastfed
 - ▶ B) Percent of infants breastfed exclusively through 6 months



Child Health Performance Measures

- ▶ **National Performance Measure:**

- ▶ Percent of children, ages 10-71 months, receiving a developmental screening using a parent-completed screening tool

- ▶ **State Performance Measures:**

- ▶ Percent of children with a payment source for dental care
- ▶ Percent of early care and education programs receiving Child Care Nurse Consultant services



Adolescent Health Performance Measures

► **National Performance Measures:**

- Percent of adolescents, ages 12-17 years, who are bullied or who bully others
- Percent of adolescents, ages 12-17 years, with a preventive medical visit in the last year

► **State Performance Measure:**

- Percent of adolescents, ages 18-24 years who report being physically active



Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs Performance Measures

- ▶ **National Performance Measures:**


- ▶ Percent of children with and without special health care needs having a medical home
- ▶ Percent of adolescents with and without special health care needs who received services necessary to make transitions to adult health care

- ▶ **State Performance Measure:**

- ▶ Percent of CYSHCN who meet the criteria for Quality of Care

- A) Percent of women who had a dental visit during pregnancy
 - B) Percent of children, ages 1 through 17 who had a preventive dental visit in the past year

Iowa Department of Public Health's Title X Family Planning Project - 2015

- The IDPH Title X project consists of an array of public and private health service providers chosen through a competitive bid process
 - 2015 – 12,151 unduplicated FP users
 - 32 clinic sites serving 45 counties
 - 7 sub-recipient agencies
 - 1 local public health jurisdiction
 - 2 large health system clinics
 - 3 Community Action Organizations
 - 1 Freestanding clinic




Why...

IDPH successfully completed a competitive application to continue the Title X Family Planning Services Project





Title X Priorities

- 1. Assuring the delivery of quality family planning and related preventive health services, with priority for services to individuals from low-income families.
 - This includes ensuring grantees/providers have the capacity to support implementation of the Title X program guidelines throughout their Title X services projects, and that project staff have received training on Title X program requirements




Title X Priorities

- 2. Assessing clients' reproductive life plan as part of determining the need for family planning services, and providing preconception services as stipulated in QFP;



Title X Priorities

- 4. Ensuring that all clients receive contraceptive and other services in a voluntary, client-centered and non-coercive manner in accordance with QFP and Title X requirements.
- 5. Addressing the comprehensive family planning and related preventive health needs of individuals, families, and communities through outreach to hard-to-reach and/or vulnerable populations, and partnering with other community-based health and social service providers that provide needed services; and



Title X Priorities

- ▶ 6. Demonstrating that the project's infrastructure and management practices ensure sustainability of family planning and reproductive health services delivery throughout the proposed service area including:
 - ▶ Incorporation of certified Electronic Health Record (EHR) systems that have the ability to capture family planning data within structured fields;
 - ▶ Evidence of contracts with insurance plans and systems for third party billing as well as the ability to facilitate the enrollment of clients into private insurance and Medicaid, optimally onsite; and to report on numbers of clients assisted and enrolled; and
 - ▶ Evidence of the ability to provide comprehensive primary care services onsite or demonstration of robust linkages with comprehensive primary care providers.



Challenges



- ▶ Medicaid Modernization
 - ▶ Ongoing issues with payment denials, including those that are prohibited by CMS
 - ▶ Credentialing issues, issues with fee schedules,
 - ▶ Underpayments
- ▶ Funding - increasing costs of providing services without increasing funding or reimbursement
- ▶ Controversies over Title X
- ▶ Telehealth??!
